

Just prior to the Scout Association announcing that face to face meetings were to come to a halt the Beaver and Cub Sections held a very successful camp at Dumfries House where they took part in a number of activities provided by Dumfries House. The Beavers and Cubs greatly enjoyed the climbing wall and archery, which was provided by the staff at Dumfries House. The Leaders ran a self programme around the activities provided by Dumfries House. The activities run by leaders included tracking, walks, games and challenges, the weekend was focussed on doing and acknowledging random acts of kindness. I can advise that you are well fed by the catering staff at Dumfries House and the children don't go hungry during their stay.

Following Lockdown taking place all three sections have continued with their Scouting activities in a new form with the facility of a zoom call. The children have enjoyed undertaking games, quizzes and puzzles during these calls as well as completing some badge work, which counts towards the Chief Scouts Award. During the Lockdown period the children have also been busy completing badge work from activity badges to a number of staged badges. The Scout Association has created an activity badge called the Great Indoors badge which some of the children have also been completing the requirement of this badge too.

Kyle and Carrick District arranged a virtual camp at virtual Loch Down Lodge which took place at the beginning of July where the children could either sleep in a tent or build a shelter or a den in their homes. There were a number of zoom calls where the children all joined together to take part in a number of activities. The camp ran as a normal camp would do with an opening ceremony as well as a closing ceremony. All those who took part greatly enjoyed the camp. TREASURER'S REPORT

Further to the Options for Offerings information contained within the June edition of the Columba News, I feel that a short update on the Church's financial position may be of interest.

I would firstly like to thank those members of the congregation who have been in touch with Peter Macdonald to arrange to have offerings remitted through the tax efficient Gift Aid scheme, or through a Standing Order arrangement.

The period from the end of March when the Government first ordered a national lockdown with Church services being cancelled, has been a very financially difficult one for Ayr St Columba. Our cash reserves over the three month period to June 30 fell by just over £20,000, and I estimate that in the current three month period to end September, the outflow in our cash reserves will increase by another £25,000 or so.

Although every effort has been made to keep our ongoing expenditure to an absolute minimum, the cash drain has resulted from three main reasons:

Firstly, income from FWO offerings has substantially declined, with only a very small number of envelopes having been handed in during the recent private prayer sessions in July.

Secondly, income normally received through Open Plate donations has totally disappeared.

Finally, in allowing the much needed work of the Church of Scotland to continue, it has urged congregations to continue remitting their monthly Ministries and Mission contributions to George Street, using Church reserves if necessary. Ayr St Columba Church has continued to remit our monthly contribution since lockdown. For information, Ministries and Mission contributions are currently utilised to cover the budget costs of the Parish Ministries Fund through which the stipends of Church of Scotland ministers are paid, and also to cover the costs associated with the operation of the four current Church of Scotland Councils.

As advised by the Session Clerk, communal services at Ayr St Columba, with much restricted numbers will re-commence on Wednesday, August 19, and I do hope that members will hand in their accumulated FWO envelopes on those occasions.

I would also like to remind members, that in addition to FWO envelopes, there are various other methods of giving to your Church, as follows:-

GIFT AID SYSTEM

Many members, who are tax payers, already make monthly standing order payments through the Gift Aid system operated by our Gift Aid Convenor Peter Macdonald. Some members may now wish to start making such payments and also register for Gift Aid. Members who wish to commence payments through Gift Aid can do so by requesting a Standing Order Mandate from the Treasurer or Church Secretary. A Gift Aid Declaration Form should also be requested from Tom or Irene and once both documents are completed as required, they should be posted to Mr P G Macdonald, 23 Dongola Road, Ayr, KA7 3BJ who will deal with them as necessary and forward the Standing Order to the member's bank.

NORMAL STANDING ORDER MANDATE

Should members of the congregation wish to start making a regular standing order payment, but do not wish to register for Gift Aid, then please email the Church Secretary Irene at : irene@ayrstcolumba.co.uk, or the Church Treasurer Tom at : cairns.tom23@gmail.com and a blank Standing Order mandate will be sent to you. This can be completed and sent to your own bank.

THE BACS SYSTEM

Members who use online banking can make payments directly into the Church bank account through the BACS system. Any members wishing to use this method should contact the Treasurer or Church Secretary for details of the Church bank account.

New look at

At our sister church in Lochside there is a requirement to provide hot food to the local community. Some 40 people take advantage of this service where during the week there is a breakfast and on a different day a lunch is provided. While there, these people can also take advantage of the provision of advice for local services, and there is a great feeling of community and wellbeing within the church. There is a large room within the church called "The Hub", and there was a small kitchen with a single sink, a fridge and an electric hob. This was proving to be inadequate for the volunteers to provide the necessary service required and the Kirk Session gave the approval to investigate the design and costing of a new kitchen.

One of the volunteers, Sheena Stewart whose architect husband Matt, kindly provided a suitable design. This was for a galley type design with three working stations for food preparation and storage, food serving, and finally a dishwashing and storage station. Each station is self contained with all the equipment necessary to support each function including fridges, freezers, hobs, oven, a microwave and dishwashers. The project was then handed to the Fabric Committee whose task was to take the requirements and go out to the marketplace to source the cabinets,

equipment and a suitable contractor. All of this was done during 2019 and a costing was submitted to the finance committee and approved at the annual business meeting in 2020.

While looking for suitable cabinets from local and UK suppliers an opportunity came to buy a high quality second hand kitchen from a family in Edinburgh. When they were told that their kitchen was going to a charitable cause they immediately offered it free of charge, where we only paid for the



transportation to Lochside. This was a great boost to the project and the cabinets were all stored in the Lochside container to await installation. Following a competitive tendering process a local joiner, was selected to install the units and although the cabinets were designed for a different layout the joiner managed to reconfigure a variety of base and corner units and build a very satisfactory solution with all electrical and plumbing services incorporated, and out of site.

Great assistance was provided by the Lochside caretaker. Michael Hall who did a lot of heavy lifting, cleaning up during the installation and very importantly making tea for the contractors on site. Once the joiner work was completed, Michael assisted John Stewart to do all of the tiling above the countertops. Greggs the bakers have donated two food storage units, one for hot foods and the other cold. Greggs have agreed to also stock, on a weekly basis, both of these cabinets with sandwiches. sausage rolls and other bakery products as part of their charitable works. Many other local shops including Tesco, and Marks and Spencers also provide foodstuffs to assist the volunteers to help the local community at The Hub and the church foodbank in this vital work. Due to the restriction of the current pandemic, the new facility has not yet been used, but the volunteers and the community are looking forward to using the new kitchen as soon as possible

The Silence of God

'In the beginning God'

What do we mean when we use the word 'God'? Different people have different understandings of God. Different world faiths offer different perspectives on the Holy. In the Christian tradition, our first thought might be to speak of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. However, can any human concept ever be adequate to



encapsulate God in God's essence? How can we speak of the Being who is not a being at all? If by 'existence' we mean what we usually mean, that is, something which is born, grows, ages and dies, then we must say that God does not 'exist'. The God who creates the universe or universes, through randomness, chance and necessity will not easily be defined by human thought. All doctrine is provisional. Like the peace of God, God's Self is beyond human understanding.

Every metaphor, image or philosophical theology is a representation of God, not God itself. God is not light, Jesus is not a lamb and the Holy Spirit is not a dove, though these terms may enrich our spiritual journey. God is always in the darkness, invisible, hidden behind our words, elusive. In his work, *Four Quartets*, the prophetic poet, T S Eliot, writes, 'I said to my soul, be still, and let the dark come upon you / Which shall be the darkness of God.' Later, he adds, 'The darkness shall be the light, and the stillness the dancing.' Perhaps darkness is the best image we could ever have of God.

The fourth century saint, Gregory of Nyssa, said the human intellect could not know the essence of God. He wrote of the 'darkness of incomprehensibility'. Saint Symeon of the eleventh century said of God, 'I have no words to name it, for that One transcends all words.' In public worship, the master of mystics, Meister Eckhart, declared 'God is light' and the people replied, 'God is not light'. In other words, God is always beyond our best definitions and most colourful dreams.

In speaking of the Sacred, it is best to do so with humility, avoiding claims of absolute truth and knowledge. The mystical insights of Judaism, Islam, Hinduism, Taoism and Buddhism draw us very close together. The Dalai Lama spoke of the Trappist monk, Thomas Merton, as a spiritual brother and knelt at his grave. The eleventh century Sufi mystic, Baba Kubi of Shiraz, wrote of seeing God in everything: in the market, the cloister, the valley and the mountain, in tribulation, favour, prayer, fasting, contemplation and the religion of the Prophet. The more we open ourselves to the mountain top experiences in other world faiths the more we discover the One Jesus called 'Father'.

For me, the common language stretching across theologies, denominations and other faiths is silence. In mission for the twenty-first century, spiritual encounter matters more than doctrinal purity. There is no eloquence greater than the silence of God. At its best, prayer moves beyond words into stillness. Imperceptibly, silence fills the soul with a peace and intimacy in a way which words will never do. The Welsh poet, R S Thomas, wrote, 'The silence in the mind is when we live best, within listening distance of the silence we call God. This is the deep calling to deep of the psalm-writer.'

Her work in speaking to callers, organising the website and Facebook pages and in generally helping and encouraging members and Elders, not to mention the Minister, in whatever way she can, has been worthy of the greatest praise. John has kept the Church in excellent order and he prepares it carefully for each private prayer session. John has been a good man to have with us at such a difficult time.

Many people coming into the Church have commented positively on the wonderful displays of flowers which are on show each week. They have graced the sanctuary and they have certainly added to our member' experiences and wellbeing in recent weeks. I am happy to acknowledge and to thank Anne Drennan for these stunning displays.

Ayr Presbytery update

Ayr Presbytery has been updating congregations on the relevant updates and information relating to Church reopening as they become available. An online induction service took place to induct the Revd Stanley Okeke to the charge of Ayr: St Andrews.

The business of the General Assembly is now being carried out by the Commission of Assembly and the Principal Clerk has suggested that Presbyteries should follow a similar procedure.

In accordance with this guidance, Ayr Presbytery has agreed to allow the Business and Nomination Committee to deal with any business for the foreseeable future.

In this connection, the Business and Nomination Committee met online by zoom on 16 June 2020 and agreed the following:

New Moderator: Presbytery installed the Revd David Prentice-Hyers, Minister of Troon: Old Parish Church as Moderator of Ayr Presbytery until 15 June 2021.

New Cumnock Parish Church: In response to the Coronavirus pandemic, the Revd Helen Cuthbert has agreed to postpone her retirement and remain as Minister at New Cumnock during this challenging time.

Prestwick: St Nicholas Parish Church: Presbytery noted that the Revd Fraser Aitken, Minister emeritus Ayr: St Columba has been appointed as Locum Minister at Prestwick: St Nicholas.
