This Guild Session should have commenced on September 28, Ayr Guilds Together Autumn Rally has been cancelled, the Guild Annual Gathering should have taken place at Dundee on September 5 and the Guild Big Sing at the Tron Church in Glasgow due to take place in December has also been cancelled.

Lochside Statement

This statement from the Session Clerk was read out at Lochside Church on Sunday 27th September.

At its September meeting, the Kirk Session of Ayr St Columba Church discussed a proposal which will affect the future of Lochside Church. The matter arose because the Presbytery of Ayr, along with all other Presbyteries across the country, has to find a way to significantly reduce the number of churches in their area. This is because the average attendance at churches generally has been falling so much in recent times and there are currently more churches than will be required in the future.

Ayr Presbytery has asked churches in the different areas of the town to develop plans for the future. The churches in North Ayr are in one group and the churches south of the river are in a different group. In due course, plans will be formed to cater for future Christian worship in each of these areas. These are plans for the long term and will not come into effect for some time.

The Kirk Session has accepted that churches north of the river will be best placed to manage the long term future of ministry and mission at Lochside and these churches will therefore be asked to include Lochside in their plans. No churches will be exempt from re-organisation and Ayr St Columba will be engaging with other churches to decide how they will fit in to the new groupings to be formed south of the river. It will be change for everyone.

At the Session meeting, Mrs Morag MacPherson spoke very strongly and passionately about the loyalty that worshippers at Lochside have shown to Ayr St Columba. This is something which we acknowledge and which we value very much. We were delighted when people at Lochside chose to become members of Ayr St Columba Church and whatever the eventual shape of churches might be in the future, everyone at Lochside Church is very welcome to remain as a member for as long as they wish and to attend services at Ayr St Columba, if they so wish.

There will be no immediate changes. Ayr St Columba will continue to support Lochside Church next week, next month and next year. During the current crisis everything will move slowly at Presbytery level. We do not know when the plans for the different areas will be drawn up and we would therefore not expect to see them put into effect for a long time.

In the meantime, we send our best wishes to Revd Roddy McNidder and to everyone in the congregation as Worship Services at Lochside take place once more. We hope you will stay safe and well and that you will enjoy your long awaited return to the building.

A special thank you to families of members who are printing off information or making sure they visit with an iPad to allow folks without the online facility to see and hear what is going on!

I continue to be indebted to our superb elders who are maintaining contact with their district regularly and keeping us up to date with anyone who is unwell or in need of an extra phone call.

The spike in Covid cases has meant that we have not been able to visit but in the short window when this was possible, I know members really appreciated a personal contact from Church.

We have a number of members in hospital or unwell at home and we keep them in our thoughts and prayers. Please keep in touch, let me know how you are keeping.

The days of sunshine are always a blessing, but when it rains remember what it was like to jump in the puddles!

It is possible to refurbish a room without it costing the earth?

Most of our activities have a carbon footprint. Household utilities, food, travel and purchase

of goods all cause emissions that add to climate change. Can we keep this to a minimum?

Cost is traditionally financial but also, can be measured in environmental impact.

Here is an example:

My daughter shared her flat with two lodgers until recently. The flat was decorated with neutral colours as is often the case with shared property.

This picture does not show it off to best effect, however the 1970s tiles and gas fire were functional but not really her taste. Interestingly this type of gas fire is very efficient and easily matches central heating, fired by a modern A+ condensing gas boiler. You can see the arm of an armchair, at least 50 years old and already recovered once. The rickety coffee table is out of sight. The 10 year old carpet is in reasonable condition



with a few minor stains in the middle and some wear.

Taste, available cash and enhancement of property value are important considerations when renovating. Should we consider anything else? What would you do if cash were in short supply? What would you do if cash were plentiful?

Here is what was done. Most of the clutter has been moved which helps show it off. The change is from bland to bold! The old gas fire has been retained but looks different with the baby pink spray paint and the ceramic lamp base has been kept and sprayed. The lampshade is new along with a

new central lampshade (seen in the mirror), coloured to match the chair fabric and walls respectively.

The wall is dark, but not gloomy, because the room has a large bay window, white ceiling and fawn carpet. The tiles around the fire place are certainly bright and the pattern is picked up by the new rug that protects the carpet from more wear centrally. The renovated coffee table has been tiled to match the fireplace. The loose joints were repaired. The ancient arm chair has not yet been recovered with the yellow fabric, but the cushion cover is new (made from material scraps with a borrowed sewing machine).

Carbon emissions are mostly down to personal decisions. Glazed tiles and paint have a carbon footprint but a decision



to refurbish rather than replace furniture, a lamp and a gas fire avoids emissions. When we choose an item that is likely to be durable, such as a tiled table, this can again reduce emissions in the long term.

It is possible to refurbish a room without it costing the earth and still make it your own.

Rules and Decisions

In the past seven months our Church has gone through a quite remarkable series of stages and experiences. We are not alone in this by any means, but the unique circumstances have required a form of thinking and decision making which we have not known before. To keep the Church alive and to provide a safe environment for worshippers have been the key elements for deliberation.

We have not had the luxury of simply choosing a date and opening the doors again. The situation has been and continues to be more than a little complex. The UK Government and the Scottish Government make regular statements regarding what is permissible.

This means the situation is changing often. Keeping up to date and alerting members to new arrangements has been a genuine challenge.

In addition to this, serious consideration must be given to the guidance from the Church of Scotland. Their guidance document attempts to address all forms of Church activity and it has been revised frequently.

We are currently operating on version 7, which contains 64 pages of detailed information.

The first five pages list no fewer than 110 changes and updates which have been made since it was first published.

Everything we do in the Church and all the decisions we make have to be in line with the rules which are operating at the time. We have been delighted by the quality of the Services that have taken place and by the attendance and the support of our members. It is reassuring to know that the environment in which we are operating has been set in accordance with the rules to make it not only welcoming and uplifting, but also as safe as it can be in these exceptional times.

The Minister has shown a calm and steady resolve to lead us though the ongoing challenges.

Faced with such a crisis so early in his ministry with us, he has responded splendidly and has ensured that the Church is well, that it is active and that it is seeking to reach and support all its members. No matter how important rules and decision-making may be, it is people who make a difference. Please be assured that we have a very good man at the helm and that we have many good people amongst us.

We continue to be grateful to everyone who supports our Minister and other decision makers in these demanding circumstances and we wish you all safe days and good health.
